Date	Activity
Monday, April 13 (Optional – Happy Easter!)	Happy Easter! Before you eat any eggs, count up the total number of eggs that you found. Count by 2s, 5s, or 10s to make your counting easier.
Tuesday, April 14	Exploring Time. Listen to the story A Second Is a Hiccup (Click here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HHEu0Zk3NkA) and brainstorm a list of other activities that take a second, a minute, an hour, a day, a week, etc.
Wednesday, April 15	Scavenger Hunt: Walk around your house to look for clocks. Don't forget to include cell phones and watches. How many clocks are in your house?
Thursday, April 16	Create your own analog clock. Use the template attached in this document to create a paper analog clock. If you don't have a printer, make your own using regular paper. Don't forget to add colour!
Friday, April 17	Parents please take time to to teach your child about the analog clock. Here's a great video to get you started: https://www.youtube.com/watch?time_continue=15&v=Kr7Ms4tjw6c&feature=emb_title (just watch the first 2 ½ minutes). Practice using the paper clock you made yesterday!

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DPA/Outdoor Learning

Date	Activity
Monday, April 13 (Optional – Happy Easter!)	Easter Egg-ercises: Complete the following activities: 5 frog jumps, 10 push ups, 15 sit ups, 20 squats, 25 jumping jacks.
Tuesday, April 14	Create a Sundial. In the morning, go outside and place a stick or straw into the ground. Use a rock or sidewalk chalk to record the shadow. Go back outside every hour (8am, 9am, 10am, etc.) to track the shadow. Talk about what you notice with an adult.
Wednesday, April 15	Sport: Pick your favourite sport (soccer, running, basketball) and play it with a family member for 30 minutes or more.
Thursday, April 16	Engineering Challenge: Create a little boat out of tin foil (about the size of your hand). Place it in a bowl of water. Slowly add coins to the boat. How many coins can you place in the boat before it sinks?
Friday, April 17	Create an obstacle course in your backyard. Using a stopwatch, record how long it takes each family member to complete the obstacle course.
